Message from the Chair

The Valentine Foundation

is about systems change. Projects that heighten workplace equity and access, promote life-changing story-telling, rely on grassroots organizing, and advance high level leadership strategy fill the ranks of the projects funded in 2015. Each is uniquely poised to advance women and girls within the workplace, school system, and community. These organizations are our engineers for change and I am excited to highlight them in this annual report.

We funded system-wide projects that address inherent inequities in the judicial and court systems, such as the work being done by Women Against Abuse, Senior Law Center, and HIAS Pennsylvania. These groups are shifting engagement and policies to reduce re-victimization of women seeking protection against domestic violence, to increase elder task force efforts targeted to older women, and to assist female immigrants seeking asylum. The women affected are often invisible due to the status of their safety, age, or country of origin. By shifting systems from victimization to areas of support, respect, and response—these organizations ensure that women's voices will be heard.

We also supported the leadership work undertaken by the American Conservatory Theatre, Bread and Roses, and the Center for Working Families. While these three groups approach the gender gap of leadership opportunities in varied fields, all of their projects rely on tested social change methods rooted in current data, in-depth trainings, and clear benchmarks for change.

The Valentine Foundation gave fifteen organizations a total of \$162,000. Of these grants, four received multiyear funding. Additionally, the Visionary Leadership Fund allocated \$22,200
